

FACS 2010 and Personalisation - making the money go round

The imperative to reduce costs with increasing demand on budgets makes the need to make robust, consistent and transparent decisions which lead to funded social care services essential. FACS 2010 determines the need to focus on the elements of early intervention, prevention and enablement before funded services are considered. Now we are looking to evaluate the risk to both independence AND well-being where unmet needs prevent the realisation of a person's outcomes.
